Ten Years of Friendship 2013-2023

- In 2012, former Consulate General Matsuda met with City and County officials and encouraged the community to consider a sister city in Japan as well as Japanese language courses in our school districts.
- •With our close ties to Honda and with our numerous Japanese companies, we began a journey to strengthen our community's ties with Japan.
- On December 2, 2013, Marysville Mayor John Gore and Yorii Mayor Makoto Shimada signed a Friendship Declaration agreement.





Japanese Business Missions: Local representatives visit Japan biennially to meet with the parent companies of local Japanese-owned facilities. The mission also includes a visit to Yorii-machi and attendance at the Midwest U.S. – Japan Association Conference. Visits have occurred in 2013, 2015, 2017, 2019 and we will be visiting in 2023.

Friendship Garden: In 2015, the City of Marysville completed Partners Park in Uptown Marysville which included a Friendship Garden. The Friendship Garden includes a Japanese stone and cherry tree, both donated by the citizens of Yorii-machi.

Special Gift to Yorii-machi: To honor our relationship with Yorii-machi, the Marysville-Yorii Friendship Committee sent a 3D printed Pottersburg Covered Bridge replica to Yorii-machi.

Japanese-focused Amenities: Efforts to attract Japanese-focused amenities to Marysville/Union County are occurring. Amenities such as grocery, entertainment, restaurants, education, lodging, and residential will satisfy the demand of our Japanese residents and visitors.

Ohio Communities in Support of Japanese Investment: In 2020, we teamed up with Logan, Miami, and Shelby Counties to begin quarterly meetings to share ideas, programs and resources.

Friendship Committee: Committee meets regularly to support our efforts.

JAPANESE YOUTH FOCUSED EFFORTS

- **Japanese Language Program:** With nearly 300 students participating, this is one of the largest programs in the state of Ohio.
- Student Exchange Program: The Marysville-Yorii Student Exchange Program began in 2015. Exchanges have occurred in years 2015-2019 and restarted in 2023.
- Columbus Japanese Language School (CJLS): The CJLS
 hosts its Saturday school at Marysville's schools in
 Creekview Intermediate Schools. The 40-year old
 program brings over 400 students to the Marysville
 Campus each week.







2023 Japan Business Mission

We had 11 delegates from our community attend, including representatives from the City of Marysville and Union County. Other communities from our region that joined the delegation included Logan County, Franklin County, City of Dublin, City of Columbus, Fayette County, The Ohio State University, One Columbus, and JobsOhio on a business mission to Japan from September 2 through September 13. In total there were 62 Ohio delegates.

The X-Tec garden also provides a learning experience for students to get them excited about discovery and technology.





Visit to Honda Logistics

Our Honda Logistics meeting also includes Midwest Express and One World Logistics, along with the team from Logan County. HLI's facility straddles both counties along US 33. HLI employs 1,500 associates and is a major employer in each county.

We discussed the need for more accessible and affordable housing for their associates and how the workforce challenges are tied to housing.



JETRO Visit

Our delegation visited a Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) event that involved matching Japanese companies looking to expand in the USA with midwestern states.

We presented The Beta District to attendees. The Beta District is a partnership between Dublin, Marysville, and Union County that has created one of the most advanced connected vehicle environments in the USA.


The 33 Smart Mobility Corridor spans three counties and 35 miles from Dublin, through Marysville, to East Liberty. It includes the Transportation Research Center, Connected Marysville, and Connected Dublin.



Ministry of Land

We had a great opportunity to meet with Japan Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport, and Tourism and the Urban Renaissance Agency. We shared information on how developments are approved in Japan and in the USA. Akiko presented the Japan Town concept to the agencies.

Japan Town is a proposed development in a conceptual form which will include housing, amenities, retail, and restaurants centered around the Japanese culture. Akiko plans to make this a reality in Marysville, and has also been a great asset on this mission providing us interpretation and guidance and going above and beyond.

Japan-America Grassroots Summit

- The Japan-America Grassroots Summit is an annual gathering of Japanese and American citizens, held alternately in Japan and America. Every year since 1991, approximately 150 people take part in the annual Grassroots Summit. Japanese prefectures and American states alternate as host regions for about one week, with locals sharing their homes and the unique features of their communities and guests enjoying sight-seeing, cultural activities, receptions, and homestays with them.
- Columbus was the host City of this event, with 9 other partners cities, including Marysville, hosting families from Japan.


